Complaint Procedures

In the event that a vendor or bidder feels that they were not offered adequate opportunity to bid on a good or service, they will have the opportunity to file an official complaint. This complaint must be made in writing within 10 days of the award announcement and addressed to the Executive Director of the organization. Upon receipt of the written complaint, the Executive Director will appoint a committee made up of themselves, the Finance Director, a Board member that was not involved in the original decision, and an attorney to review the selection process to ensure it was followed appropriately and fairly. In addition, a copy of the original complaint and any subsequent correspondence or response will be sent to the

awarding agency immediately. This review will take place within 15 days of the receipt of the complaint. A written decision

will be sent to the complainant within 10 days of the review panel decision. All instances of a complaint will be disclosed immediately to the awarding agency. The complainant must exhaust all administrative remedies with the agency before pursuing a protest with the State of Federal grantor. Reviews of protests by the Federal agency will be limited to: 1) Violations of Federal law or regulations and the standards of 10 CFR Part 600.236 (violations of State or local law will be under the jurisdiction of State or local authorities) and, 2) Violations of the grantee's or subgrantee's protest procedures for failure to review a complaint or protest. Protests received by the Federal agency other than those specified above will be referred to the grantee or subgrantee.

Looking Back

A resident thought Jesus returned by airplane

The sight of a modern airplane taking off or one in flight across the sky is an amazing sight even if person have become accustomed to it. My small sons loved to go to the Raleigh-Durham airport where they could see huge passenger planes take off at the rate of one every minute or two.

It is an especially difficult sight to understand when a person knows the plane's possible weight, unless one understands the physics that is involved. The average weight of an aircraft has been stated to be around 90,000 pounds, plus fuel and cargo.

A Boeing model 747-400 has a maximum takeoff capacity of around 437 tons! Thus, how amazing is the upward power of air pressure beneath the wings to supply the lift, with the curved shape of the front of the wings creating a vacuum atop them!

Now consider the reaction of some inhabitants of rural Appalachia when they first spotted one of these roaring monsters coming across the ridge! There is every possibility that some of them had never read a newspaper or heard a radio broadcast to inform them of this invention. They may never have talked to someone who had read about this or even have been to the "big city" to see one of these "infernal contraptions."

Among such persons were those who had knowledgeable of the Bible and who would immediately have thought of the New Testament text at I Thessalonians 4:17.

Speaking of the future return to earth of the Risen Christ, the writer says that the "dead in Christ will arise first, then we who are alive who are left will be caught up in the clouds together with them to meet the Lord in the air; and so we will be with the Lord forever." Suddenly, there it was: Jesus coming through the clouds of heaven! The Saints of the Church might have rejoiced a bit, but the majority of humankind would have been seized with terror!

Two instances of local reaction to this strange phenomenon have reached my ears. Both have been recorded in my volume entitled Ticklers from the Toe: Humor from the Counties of Avery, Mitchell, and Yancey, 2013.

Among the stories that I have heard about this, the one that "sticks in my mind" is about the family of Andy Bailey who lived near my Bailey grandparents on Bailey Branch of Jacks Creek.

My grandmother could remember that first sighting which likely was around 1920. Andy's family was out working in the field when the fearsome mon-

ster suddenly appeared with a previously unknown and loud sound. Andy's small grandchildren ran screaming to him, "Pray, Grandpa, pray! Jesus is a-coming!"

When I hear this story, I do not know whether to smile or to feel sympathy for the terror that these small children must have felt.

The other story has been related to me by my friend Bob Wilson of Burnsville.

When the first airplane appeared over the mountains of Western North Carolina, it took some of the local residents by surprise.

In this remote corner of the State, news of the outside world was slow in arriving. Many of the folks living up in the "hollers" and the coves of Yancey County had never heard of Wilbur and Orville Wright.

One such family was the Allens of Pensacola. On a warm sunny day, Grandmaw Allen was sitting on the porch, busy shelling peas or stringing beans, when a strange noise caught her attention. She paused from her work and listened to the sound that seemed to be coming closer. Her son, Roswell, was in the yard chopping wood and hearing the sound, dropped his axe to listen.

As the sound grew louder, Grandmaw Allen set aside her basket, stood up and walked to the edge of the porch. Shielding her eyes from the sun with her hand, she scanned the nearby ridge. Suddenly, a strange looking object appeared on the horizon.

They both stood as if frozen to the spot as they watched the object move slowly across the sky. Finally, Grandmaw yelled to her son, "Get down on your knees, Roswell! You've fooled around 'till Jesus has come!"

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on March 22, 2021, Piedmont Natural Gas Company, Inc. (Piedmont or the Company), filed an application with the Commission in Docket No. G-9, Sub 781 requesting authority to adjust and increase its rates and charges for natural gas service in North Carolina. The Company serves approximately 775,000 retail customers in North Carolina. On April 13, 2021, the Commission issued an Order Establishing General Rate Case and Suspending Rates.

Also on April 13, 2021, the Public Staff filed a Motion to Consolidate Dockets requesting that the Commission issue an order consolidating the previously consolidated Docket Nos. G-9, Sub 722, Piedmont's redelivery services agreement for Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC's Lincoln Plant, and G-9, Sub 781 with Docket No. G-9, Sub 786, in which Piedmont filed a request for approval of modifications to its existing Equipment Rebate Program and of three new energy efficiency programs: Residential New Construction Program, Commercial Food Services Program, and Commercial HVAC & Water Heating Program. On April 19, 2021, the Commission issued an order granting the Public Staff's motion and consolidating the above-referenced dockets (collectively, the Application).

In the Application, Piedmont requests authority to increase its rates and charges to produce additional overall annual North Carolina retail revenues of approximately \$109 million, an increase of approximately 10.4% over current revenues. Further, Piedmont is seeking approval of a rate of return on common equity of 10.60%.

Piedmont also seeks (i) a general increase in and revisions to the rates and charges for customers served by the Company; (ii) continuation of Piedmont's Integrity Management Rider ("IMR") mechanism contained in Appendix E to its approved service regulations; (iii) continued regulatory asset treatment for certain incremental Transmission Integrity Management Program (TIMP) and Distribution Integrity Management Program (DIMP) Operations and Maintenance (O&M) expenses, and certain incremental environmental cleanup and remediation O&M expenses; (iv) continued utilization of the depreciation rates for the Company's North Carolina and joint property assets approved in Docket No. G-9, Sub 743 (Sub 743), the Company's most recent general rate case;

(v) revised and updated amortizations and recovery of certain regulatory assets accrued since the Sub 743 proceeding; (vi) utilization of the lead-lag study filed by Piedmont in its Sub 743 filing; (vii) adoption of a Rider mechanism to allow Piedmont to recover the costs of its approved energy efficiency programs from customers or, in the alternative, authorization to defer costs associated with Piedmont's approved energy efficiency programs pending amortization at the Commission's discretion at some later date; and (viii) other updates and revisions to Piedmont's rate schedules and service regulations.

On April 13, 2021, the Commission issued an order suspending the Company's proposed rate changes for a period of up to 270 days from the proposed effective date of April 21, 2021, and setting the Application for a general rate increase for hearing.

The Commission has instituted an investigation into the Application and has scheduled the matter for public witness hearings on Wednesday, July 14, 2021, to be held remotely via Webex with telephonic access. The first session will begin at 1:30 p.m. and end at the earlier of the conclusion of the last witness' testimony or 4:30 p.m. The second session will begin at 6:30 p.m. and end at the earlier of the last witness' testimony or 10:30 p.m. A link to view the hearing will be available at www.ncuc.net.

The hearings on July 14, 2021, will be solely for the purpose of receiving the testimony of public witnesses in accordance with Commission Rule R1-21(g). The Commission reserves the right to limit testimony at the public witness hearing pursuant to Commission Rule R1-21(g)(5).

Members of the public that would like to testify must register in advance of the hearing, no later than 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, July 8, 2021, by contacting the Public Staff via email at PublicHearings@psncuc.nc.gov or by calling 919-733-6110. When registering, provide your name, docket number (G-9, Sub 781), telephone number you will use to participate in the hearing, and the topic of your testimony.

Only individuals registered with the Public Staff by 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, July 8, 2021, will be allowed to testify at the hearings.

The hearing will resume on Tuesday, September 7, 2021, at 2:00 p.m., and will continue as required for testimony and cross-examination of expert witnesses for the Company, the Public Staff, and other intervenors. Below is a table with the proposed North Carolina retail revenue increase by customer class:

The increases within the above-listed rate classes would vary by rate schedule.
EFFECT OF RATES
For existing residential customers, the proposed rates (including the effects of all riders) would change the average monthly bill (including state sales tax) of a residential customer as follows:

Season	Existing Rates	Proposed Rates	Change in Average Bill
Winter	\$126.75	\$140.33	\$13.58
Summer	\$32.10	\$36.13	\$4.03
Average	\$71.54	\$79.54	\$8.00

The change in average bill will vary with each customer's level of natural gas usage. The Commission may consider additional or alternative rate design proposals that were not included in the Company's Application and may order increases or decreases in individual rate schedules that differ from those proposed by the Company, but the Commission will not consider any increase in total revenues beyond that requested by the Company.

As stated above, the Commission suspended the proposed rate changes and scheduled the Application for investigation and hearing. Persons who desire to present testimony for the record should appear at one of the public hearings. Persons who desire to send written statements to inform the Commission of their positions in the matter should address their statements to the North Carolina Utilities Commission, 4325 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, North Carolina 27699-4300, and reference Docket No. G-9, Sub 781. However, such written statements cannot be considered competent evidence unless those persons appear at the hearing and testify concerning the information contained in their written statements. Persons can also email the Commission a statement about the Application via the Commission's website at www.ncuc.net/contactus.html. In either case, consumer statements will be placed in Docket No. G-9, Sub 781CS, and may be accessed by searching that docket number via the Commission's website.

Persons having an interest in the investigation and desiring to intervene in the matter as formal parties of record may file their petitions to intervene not later than August 4, 2021. These petitions should reference Docket No. G-9, Sub 781, and should be filed with the North Carolina Utilities Commission, 4325 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, North Carolina 27699-4300.
