

Penland Summer Camps: Tons of Fun Coming Right Up!

If you are looking for something fun and educational for your child to do this summer, you'll be glad to know there are still some spaces left in the summer art camps at Penland School of Craft. These take place in June and July, with different artists covering a range of activities for kids as young as six all the way up to camps for teenagers. Most are half-day, either morning or afternoon; the clay camp is full-day. A number of camps have filled already; these are the ones that still have openings.

Silkworms and Sheep with Lisa Rose, June 13-17, ages 11-13. Learn to paint imagery on silk and then make small sculpture and other objects from wool felt.

Papermaking and Books with Ani Volkan, July 25-29, ages 14-17. Make paper from scratch and then use it to make your own books.

From Drawings to Tiny Treasures with Samantha Kirk, July 4-8, ages 6-8. Make colorful drawings and then transform them into all sorts of objects using the classic medium of Shrinky Dinks!

Digging, Testing, and Working with Wild Clay with

Hanna Traynham, July 18-22, ages 14-17. Learn to dig clay from the ground, process it, and make it into pots.

Woodworking Adventure with Sam Maren, July 25-29, ages 8-11. Learn to use hand tools and wood to make toy race cars, spinning tops, and boxes.
