set limits of the zone are 50 feet

voting place, measured when
that door is closed, but in no
event is the limit at more than 50
feet or at less than 25 feet.

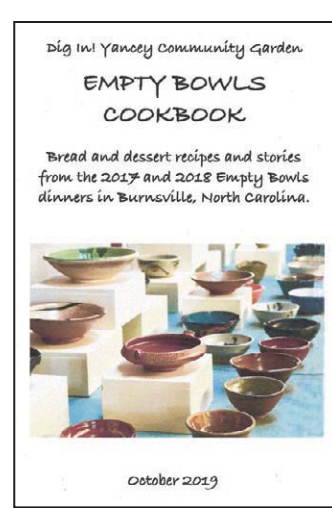
The poll workers will mark
