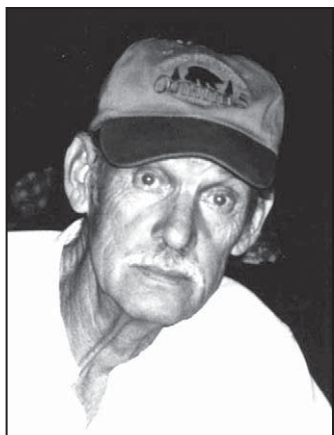


Obituaries

Jana Marie Bartleson, 66, of Burnsville left her earthly home on March 24, 2020. Raised in Cocoa Beach FL Jana moved to Yancey County 39 years ago and knew she was home. She received Bachelor's and Master's degrees from the UT, Knoxville, where she studied community nutrition and became a Registered Dietitian.

Serving the people of Yancey, Mitchell and Avery Counties for 37 years as a nutritionist and health promotion specialist with the Toe River Health District, the local public health department, Jana is fondly remembered by the many families she touched. Her stamp on Yancey County can be seen everyday. She supported the farmer's market, demonstrating ways to prepare the food that was there any given week. As a founding member of Dig in! Community Garden she did the same at their summer harvest tables. She worked with the High Peaks Trails Association on walking and hiking maps and served on the Burnsville planning commission advocating walkability. An avid tennis player she founded the Yancey youth tennis camp in 2008 that continues today. In 2007 Jana was honored by the NC Public Health Association with the Bertlyn Bosley Award for Excellence in Public Health Nutrition.

One of those fortunate people whose job is their passion, Jana tended a home garden filled with vegetables and flowers and cooked amazing food for family and friends. She took frequent hikes and backpacking trips in the local mountains and on the Appalachian Trail. She enjoyed dancing, reading, kayaking, camping, traveling, bike riding, theater, music and conversation.

For Jana, life was all about people. No matter if you were a client she served in her role as a nutritionist, a co-worker, friend or family member, her gift was an ever-present ability to appreciate and love the individuality of others. She was abundantly open to and supportive of new ideas. Her enthusiasm, smiles and laughter were always there to light up one's day.

Part of a large blended family Jana was preceded in death by her parents Harold "Bart" Bartleson and Jean Sealey Bartleson Crook; her adoptive father Norbert Vaughn, step father Jimmy Crook and sister Julie Crook. Surviving are her daughter, the love of her life, Lily Xin Ru Bartleson who moved home from Chicago to care for her mother, sisters Carla Hanks and husband Wayne of Crawfordville FL and Elizabeth Wendell of Grayson GA, brothers David Crook of Naples FL, Stephen Crook of Grayson GA and Randy Vaughn of Friendswood TX and 2 exchange students, Zulema Loya of Mexico and Laura Oosterloo of The Netherlands.

Jana is also survived by many friends. She was great at bringing people together for events and projects and was especially adept at connecting people with the right organization for their interests and talents. A member of St. Thomas Episcopal Church, Jana served on the Justice and Outreach committee. She also engaged in deep spiritual practice through prayer and meditation. A private burial was held in the Celso Community Cemetery with her Pastor and friend Rev. Beth Turner presiding. A memorial service will be held at a later date.

LEGAL NOTICE PURSUANT TO NCGS 160a-364:

The public shall take notice that on June 4, 2020 at 6:00 p.m., the Burnsville Town Council will hold a public hearing during the regular monthly business meeting in the Town Center at 6 South Main Street, Burnsville, North Carolina. The purpose of the public hearing to take public comment on proposed amendments to the Sign Ordinance and Zoning Ordinance for the Town of Burnsville. Due to the Covid 19 pandemic, the meeting will be closed to all members of the public. The public may listen to the meeting on YouTube at the Burnsville Town Center Channel. Comments for the public hearing may be submitted in writing as follows:

Members of the public wishing to make comment on the amendments may do so at any time after this notice appears in the newspaper up and until 24 hours after the public hearing ends. Written comments may be submitted to publiccomment@townofburnsville.org. Please specify in your email which public hearing you are making comment on.

The proposed amendments are as follows:

Sign Ordinance Amendments.

1. Amend the definitions to remove the following regulatory language from section 1.3 Definitions- Electronic Message Boards and placing the same language within the revised Chart for the zoning districts:

Electronic Message Boards shall be limited to light emitting diode (LED) or liquid crystal display (LCD) boards and shall not contain any scrolling, moving or animated display. The minimum time between any display change shall be three seconds for onsite commercial signs.

2. Section 1.7.5-Size and Location Requirements: The redundant text of A, B, B(i), B(ii) and B(iii) shall be deleted as the same appears within the Sign Regulation Chart located in section 1.7.5. The text in D shall be amended to read "Properties shall be subject to the sign regulations set out in the Sign Regulation Chart below based on the zoning district they are located within. The Chart is amended to include the existing regulations for zoning districts C-3 and R-10 which previously were not contained in the Sign Regulation Chart.

Zoning Ordinance Amendments

1. Article 4 Section 401-Definitions: The following definition shall be added as section 401.49.1 Modular Homes-Modular home means a dwelling unit constructed in accordance with the standards set forth in the North Carolina State Building Code and composed of components substantially assembled in a manufacturing plant and transported to the building site for final assembly on a permanent foundation. Off Frame Modular Homes are lifted by crane and placed on a required permanent foundation. On Frame Modular Homes consist of two or more sections transported to the site in a manner similar to manufactured homes or may consist of a series of panels or room sections transported on a truck and erected or joined together on the site.

2. Article 8 Section 800-R-10 Residential District: The following shall be added to permitted uses in R-10 Residential District section 1(a) Modular Homes-single family dwellings: ANY homes constructed of closed construction at an off-site location, of any size, are permitted subject to the following special requirements:

a. The Home must be off frame construction.

b. The Home must meet all requirements of any currently used addition of North Carolina State Building Residential Code and be permitted by the local building official having jurisdiction over the building site.

c. The Home is constructed, inspected and certified under the North Carolina Modular Construction Program.

d. The Home must meet the minimum construction and design standards for modular homes pursuant to NCGS 143-139.1.

e. The Home must meet local zoning and set back requirements as set forth in the Zoning Ordinance for the Town of Burnsville.

f. The Home must meet community protective covenant requirements as applicable.

g. On Frame Modular Homes are permitted in mobile home parks subject to the provisions for mobile home parks in the Town of Burnsville Zoning Ordinance.

h. Structures constructed at an off-site location that do not meet the above requirements and were not originally constructed for use as dwellings are prohibited.

3. Article 9-Design Guidelines: The following shall be deleted and removed from Article 9:

a. The Land Use Density, Yard and Height Requirement Chart and the footnotes thereto.

4. Article 10-General Provisions: The following shall be added to Article 10 as new section 1000-A:

a. The Land Use Density, Yard and Height Requirement Chart and the footnotes thereto (previously shown in Article 9).

5. References to the Article 9 Density, Yard and Height Requirement Chart throughout the Zoning Ordinance are hereby deleted and shall be amended to reflect "Section 1000-A" for location reference conformity.

6. Article 8 Section 804 C-3 District: Section 2 conditional uses shall add the following as 2(c):

Accessory buildings to existing or newly constructed single-family dwellings including garage apartments as defined in Article 4 may be permitted upon the following conditions:

i. Such uses or structures shall be located in the rear yard.

ii. Such uses or structures shall maintain a minimum setback of five (5) feet from rear lot lines and shall observe setback requirements from all other lot lines as specified in Article 10 Density, Yard and Height Requirement Chart.

iii. No accessory uses or structures situated on a corner lot shall extend beyond the front yard line required for abutting property on the side street.

iv. No greenhouse heating plant shall be located within twenty-five (25) feet of any lot line.

v. Such uses or structures shall be located not less than ten (10) feet from the principal building.

A second primary election will be held on Tuesday, June 23, 2020 in Yancey County to vote in the following contests: (REPUBLICAN) US HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT 11.

Voters will not be required to show photo ID when they vote in the second primary election on June 23, 2020. In a December 31 order, a federal district court blocked North Carolina's voter photo ID requirement from taking effect. The injunction will remain in place until further order of the court.

Polls will be open from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. on the day of the election, Tuesday, June 23. One-stop early voting will be held at the Yancey County Board of Elections. One-stop early voting will be open weekdays from 8:30 am until 5:00 pm, beginning Thursday, June 4 through Friday, June 19, and Saturday, June 20 from 8:00am until 3:00pm. Canvass will be held in the Yancey County Board of Elections office at 11:00 a.m. on Monday, July 6, 2020.

Absentee voting by mail is available. Requests for an absentee ballot must be made on an absentee request form (available on the State Board of Elections website and at the county board of elections office), and must be received in the Yancey County Board of Elections office by 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, June 16. Completed request forms may only be returned in-person to the Yancey County Board of Elections by the voter, the voter's near relative or verifiable legal guardian, or by a Multipartisan Assistance Team, or delivered by the U.S. Postal Service or designated delivery service (DHL, FedEx, or UPS). Absentee voting requires the voter to complete an application on the return envelope that must be witnessed by two qualified persons or a notary public. Completed absentee ballots must be returned to Yancey County Board of Elections by 5:00 p.m. on Election Day (ballots received by mail after this time will be timely if received within three business days and postmarked by Election Day). Voters may receive assistance voting a mail-in absentee ballot from a near relative or verifiable legal guardian, or by a qualified person of their choice if a near relative or legal guardian is not available. If the voter lives in a facility such as a nursing home, and the voter's near relative or legal guardian is not available, the voter or the facility can arrange to have the county board of elections schedule a visit by a Multipartisan Assistance Team to provide assistance and serve as witnesses.

All persons who are registered as Republican or Unaffiliated voter's that voted a Republican ballot or did not vote in the March 3rd Primary may vote in this election.

Voters voting in person are entitled to assistance by an election official, or, if assistance is needed due to disability or illiteracy, by a qualified person of their choice. Voting sites are accessible to all voters. Curbside voting is available for voters who are not able to enter voting sites.
